AS AN CINEMATOGRAPHY AWARDS



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Welcome to the Asian Cinematography Awards.

From the moment we opened the call for submissions in March last year, we knew that the festival had the potential to showcase a diverse selection of films. Even though we are focused on celebrating Asian filmmakers, submissions were also invited from filmmakers in other parts of the world who want their films screened to Asian audiences. We were delighted to receive almost 300 film submissions from 48 different countries. Of these, 22 films have been chosen as part of the official selection. An additional 10 films which highlight specific Filipino stories complete the festival program.

Although we have a number of films from experienced filmmakers, most of the films you are about to see during the festival are from emerging talent. This is very much in line with the aim of the Cinematography Awards Foundation: to give a platform to new and emerging filmmakers across the globe, allowing their films and stories to reach as many live audiences as possible.

Above all, as our name suggests, we want to celebrate the art of cinematography. Our main awards will be given to cinematographers and filmmakers who have shown outstanding creative and technical skills in bringing to life the aesthetic vision of their films. This year, we are honored to have the award-winning Filipino cinematographer Carlo Mendoza and the Amsterdam based Portuguese videographer Joao Costa as members of the jury.

Carlo Mendoza will be our guest speaker for the Special Talk event during the festival. We'll discuss his career and his collaboration with local and international film directors. We'll also talk about the challenges for Asian cinematographers hoping to work on international projects, particularly in Hollywood.

Joao Costa will travel with us to Naga City, Philippines to help with our Foundation's community and educational program, the Young Shutterbugs Project. He will be part of a workshop to teach school children the basics of photography. We believe in teaching young people a skill which they will find useful and inspirational.

During the festival, we are also excited to be launching CineLab Talents, a workshop in partnership with Celtx, the cloud-based media pre-production software company. Twenty participants will have a chance to attend lectures from our two jury members and from the Cinematography Awards President, Peter Wieczorek about visual storytelling, camera and lighting. Participants will also have the opportunity to pitch a story concept.

We'd like to thank all our creative staff for their efforts to make this event possible. We are also grateful to all the filmmakers who have submitted their work.

We hope you enjoy all these wonderful films.






